### **Event Medical Services**

# Why Professional Medical Services?



We often get the question of why a professional medical service versus volunteer first aid teams? This is a very challenging question to answer, so we have some information below to provide a better understanding of the differences, and the questions to ask when hiring a provider.

All events carry a certain degree of liability, and in most cases if you look closely into your insurance requirements they require some type of on-site medical service.

What most events do not know is what *medical services* means, and what services

like Superior EMS provide versus volunteer groups in the community. Many of these organizations are actually only providing *first aid* services, which is fundamentally different.

When considering hiring or requesting services at your event, consider the following:

- Does the company have comprehensive medical malpractice and general liability insurance?
- Are the staff/volunteers certified to the Paramedic Association of Canada's national occupational competency profiles for paramedics or have they just completed a 40 hour advanced first aid course?
- Do the staff/volunteers undergo routine training and competency testing?
- Do they have the proper equipment such as the appropriate medical supplies, defibrillator and emergency drugs?
- Do they have a professional environment to treat the patients such as an ambulance type vehicle, a field tent with privacy walls, and the proper equipment inside?
- Are the staff delegated under a medical oversight program to provide the proper levels of care?

The challenge is that in Ontario, private providers are not regulated. There are no standards on the level of certification staff/volunteers must have, leaving event organizers and companies open to significant liability should an emergency occur and the providers are not appropriately trained, under equipped or not properly insured.

Many volunteer organizations, security companies, and off-duty medical personnel will provide services under the assumption that the "good samaritan act" will protect them, or in some instances the organization will require the organizer to list them as an additional insured on the event policy putting all of the liability on the event organizers. This could be a costly mistake as they are actually considered "targeted responders", and are not covered under the act. Most event insurance plans will cover "incidental" malpractice, however targeted responders do not provide incidental services, they are there for the purpose of providing first aid/medical aid voiding the incidental malpractice coverage.

It is very important to know the services you are receiving at your event. Ask the right questions when booking with the organization you select, including details on their insurance, qualifications, medical control and other service details to ensure you are protected, and your patrons are protected.

The term *medical* in recent past has been widly used by providers with no actual *medical* training. Ensure you are informed before booking.

# Minimizing your Risks

By having an effective, and experienced medical service at your event, you can minimize the risks and ensure your attendees get immediate **medical** attention if they need it.

Here are some facts related to risks at events:

- Large crowds increase the risk for injury significantly.
- By their nature, sporting events have risk of serious injury.
- Any event where alcohol is being served has a higher risk of injury.
- Weather can have a major impact on the injury rate.
- Certain events (i.e. motorsports, concerts, large gatherings) carry a higher risk of injury/illness.

## **Medical Service Tips for Event Organizers**

- In environments of limited health care resources, the sooner an injured or ill person is treated, the better chance of their recovery.
- Medical services should be provided for the entire event, including setup, and breakdown of the event if it is a large scale or dangerous operation.
- Medical services may also be needed for attendees queuing to get in and out of the event.
- If the event is multi-day with attendees camping overnight, you may need around the clock medical services.
- The medical team needs to be located carefully throughout your event to ensure response times are minimized.
- Provide information about the location of medical facilities to attendees. Use signs and print the information on any maps, websites, or other materials.
- All event staff should be aware of the closest medical team to them
- External resources including municipal paramedics, fire department, police and other resources need clear access in and out of the venue, especially a direct route to the on-site medical services.
- Large crowds or difficult to access events may require medics on foot, utility response
  vehicles, and bike response teams in order for timely access and transport to the on-site
  medical facility
- Know the difference between first aid and medical services and the impact it may have on someones survival and quality of care received at your event.
